Flight Scholarship

EAA Chapter 631 and Island City Aero Club

EAA Chapter 631 and Island City Aero Club are combining to award a \$2,000 scholarship for primary flight instruction to a person at least 16 years of age who resides within a 7 county service area. There are several requirements which are listed on the joint application form. The Flight Scholarship is **authorized** at the beginning of a student's training, but the **funds are provided following the successful receipt of the private pilot license.**

The requirements and details are:

- 1) One award will be authorized per year.
- 2) Resident Barron, Bayfield, Chippewa, Polk, Rusk, Sawyer or Washburn County.
- 3) Applications are due by March 1, each year on a joint form.
- 4) Applicant must be a person at least 16 years of age.
- 5) An introductory Flight Lesson with a Certified Flight Instructor is required.
- 6) A minimum FAA Class 3 Medical License is required prior to application.
- 7) A FAA Student Pilots License is required prior to application.
- 8) A letter of recommendation from a Certified Flight Instructor is required.
- 9) An essay about your aviation goals with no more than 1000 words is required.
- 10) Payment will be authorized with the student selection but paid upon completion.
- 11) Applications reviewed by a Selection Committee (2 members from each Club).
- 12) A recommendation of the Scholarship Committee will be voted on by each Club.
- 13) A letter of agreement will be drafted for each recipient.
- 14) A mentor will be assigned by the Selection Committee.
- 15) Flight training may be provided by any CFI.
- 16) Training must be completed within two years following the award.
- 17) Each Club will issue a payment of \$1,000 upon completion.
- 18) This joint Flight Scholarship may be combined with any other scholarship.
